What is Niigata City Shinsei Junior High School?

It is a public junior high school which provides lessons for persons who have not graduated from junior high school for various reasons or persons who did not receive a sufficient education due to reasons such as school refusal, in order to ensure that they have an opportunity to receive compulsory education.

Who can enroll?

Persons who meet all of the following criteria:

1. Persons registered as residents of Niigata City
※Persons registered as a resident of a municipality other than Niigata City: please consult with the board of education where you live.
2. Persons who have not graduated from junior high school for various reasons or persons who did not receive a sufficient education due to reasons such as school refusal.
3. Persons who were born on or before April 1st, 2012.

What will you learn?

- Class subjects are the same as a daytime junior high school, including Japanese language, social studies, mathematics, science, music, art, health and physical education, technology and home economics, and English. In addition, there is moral education, as well as class activities, integrated studies, and school events.
- Japanese language learning is available for persons who are not confident in their Japanese. (You cannot only enroll in Japanese language class.)
- You can study elementary school curriculum for some subjects.

When are classes held?

- Classes are held Monday to Friday, from 5:50 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- Each class is 40 min. There are four lessons a day.

1st period:	5:50 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. (40 min.)
2nd period:	6:35 p.m. to 7:15 p.m. (40 min.)
Homeroom:	7:15 p.m. to 7:20 p.m. (5 min.)
Break:	7:20 p.m. to 7:35 p.m. (15 min.)
3rd period:	7:35 p.m. to 8:15 p.m. (40 min.)
4th period:	8:20 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. (40 min.)
